

Welcome back to the beginning of Term four. If you were able to get away or spend time with family in Sydney, I hope you and your children had an enjoyable holiday.

EXTRAORDINARY SHOWCASE OF STUDENT WORK

I am very proud to be a Principal of such a remarkable school and last Thursday was another rewarding day of my teaching career. Along with a professionally dynamic staff, we have proceeded on a transformational pedagogical journey to further engage our students with high expectations of student work with purpose and an authentic audience. Outcomes in English, Mathematics, Geography, Creative Arts and Science and Technology were achieved within the integrated units enabling students to deepen their understanding and knowledge of required content areas as well as scientific, computational, design and systems thinking skills. Our Year 5 and 6 classrooms unveiled effective innovative classroom practices which have increased creativity, critical thinking and problematic knowledge. In addition to these skills we saw the development of breaking tasks into parts and steps, the planning and management of time, the giving and receiving of constructive feedback, effective communication and the importance of patience and resilience. Each 4/5S, 5D and 6M student worked as part of a group for the 'Belrose Organisation for Marine Protection' and presented their completed work to K-6 students, Michael Regan, the Mayor of Northern Beaches, Jason Falinski, Minister for Mackellar, Jann Pattinson, Director, Educational Leadership, Jacob Leslie and to their parents by digital platforms.

LEADERSHIP POSITIONS FOR 2021

We have begun the process for the selection of our student leaders for 2021. Our timeline is as follows:

Monday 26 October

Provisional student leader 2021 badges will be presented to all nominees. These badges will be worn every school day for two weeks.

Monday 9 November - Friday 13 November

On Monday, 9 November at 9:00am each candidate will prepare a speech outlining how he/she will fulfil the role of school leader, as per the nomination form during class time.

Following recess, students will deliver the speeches to Years 2 - 6. Students and staff vote for the student leaders using the official ballot paper with photographs of each candidate. The vote will be conducted using the 'preferential voting system'. Students must present their speeches in full school uniform.

Executive staff meeting to count votes and to finalise leadership team.

Mrs Zorian and Executive staff interview the leadership team and announce the Elected Leaders to all candidates.




















Beautification of School


