ACCESS TO THE LATEST TECHNOLOGY

All learning areas at Belrose PS have the installation of Commboxes (Touch screen digital panels). The School and the P&C since 2019 have funded the installation of 15 sets within the school. Our school does not have to rely on parents purchasing BYOD devices, ipads, laptops and desktops. To support our strategic direction for active learning approaches for student engagement, each classroom has ipads, chrome books, desktops and laptops. These devices have supported our pedagogical shift in how we teach and engage student learning. Access to technology can:

-accelerate learning as students access information at a faster pace

-support teacher differentiation

-engage students further with key elements of dialogue and teamwork

-provide opportunities for computational thinking

We are putting steps in place to provide our students with the knowledge, skills and capabilities to lead and flourish in tomorrow's world.

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AUSTRALIA MY COUNTRY COMPETITION 2021 INSTRUCTIONS

For Year 3 to Year 6 School Students.

Closing date for Entries is Friday 14th May 2021 We are unable to extend the closing date for entries

Entries will be collected from each School during week ending Friday 21st May 2021

The competition, which is free to all entrants, is proudly sponsored by the Forestville sub-Branch of the Returned & Services League of Australia and is conducted in conjunction with School Principals and Teachers. It has been designed to enhance in students their sense of pride and patriotism in being an Australian through Writing and Art.

The topic for 2021 is "Australian Military Aviation and the Centenary of the Royal Australian Air Force". The topic acknowledges the significant contribution that air power has made to the defence of Australia. However, it is slightly broader than purely the RAAF, in acknowledgement of the role played by the pioneers of the Australian Flying Corps as an integral part of the Australian Imperial Force both in France and the Middle East in World War 1. As far as topic analysis is concerned, it is not one limited to just combat aircraft but also includes areas such as transport aircraft, maritime surveillance and rescue aircraft such as Catalinas, helicopters, drones, airfield defence and construction and famous personalities such as Charles Kingsford-Smith, Hudson Fysh and Wing Commander Hughie Edwards, VC, DSO, OBE, DFC.

Conditions and Guidelines:

- 1. Students can choose between written work (composition or poetry) or art works.
- Essays and compositions should not include more than one illustration, and must be written on one side only with a maximum of two A4 size sheets of paper using font 12.
- Art works must not be larger than A3 size or 30.5cm x 40.7cm canvas. We regret photographs, models and dioramas cannot be accepted.
- The entrant's Teacher and Parent/Guardian must certify that the work submitted is largely the unaided work of the entrant. PLEASE ENSURE WE CAN READ THE REQUIRED INFORMATION.
- Entries are to be the work of one student as no joint effort can be accepted and only one entry per student per section is permitted.

6. ENTRY FORMS

- a. WRITTEN WORK entry forms must be stapled to the FRONT of each entry.
- b. ART WORK entry forms must be attached (preferably glued) to the BACK of each entry.
- 7. Entries become the property of the RSL and may be published in print and/or electronically.
- 8. The judges' decision is final and no correspondence will be entered into.
